We hope as many of you as possible can be on hand to congratulate our graduates.

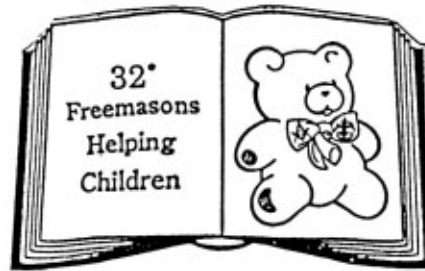

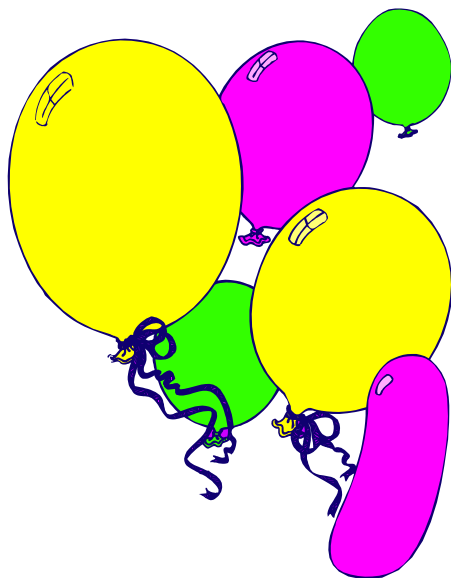
