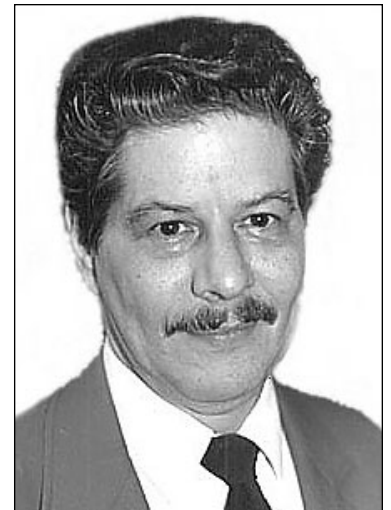

The United States Air Force Band of Flight Concert Band Commanded by Lt. Colonel Alan C. Sierichs

U. S. Air Force Band Holiday Concert December 3rd

The United States Air Force Band of Flight returns to The Cleveland Masonic Center Auditorium for a Christmas Holiday Concert on Friday evening, December 3, 2004 beginning at 8:00 p.m.

While tickets for this great evening are free, the concert will be advertised to the public in early November. Seating is limited. If you plan to attend, then order tickets with the form below. There will be no tickets available the night of the concert and you must have a ticket to attend.

The United States Air Force Band of Flight is one of 12 bands in the Air Force. It is one of the oldest bands in the Air Force and has an unbroken record of service since its formation.

The band was activated September 29, 1942 at Patterson Field (later Wright Patterson AFB) as the 361st Army Air Force Band. Between 1942 and 1948, the band was redesignated three times: as the 661st Army Band, then as the 661st Army Air Force Band on January 2, 1948. It was redesignated as an Air Force Band, not quite four months after the Air Force became a separate branch of service. In 1991 the band was redesignated as the Air Force Band of Flight.

In December 1997 the Concert Band was selected by the John Phillip Sousa Foundation to receive the Colonel George S. Howard Citation of Musical Excellence for Military Concert Bands.

This is the second time the Band of Flight Concert Band has received this prestigious award.

The U. S. Air Force Band of Flight is commanded by Lt. Colonel Alan Sierichs.

The Band's purpose is to support the Global Air Force Mission in war and peace by fostering our national heritage and by providing professional musical products and services for official military, recruiting and community relation events.

The Air Force Band of Flight consists of forty-five active duty musicians. It is the largest single ensemble within the Band of Flight.

The Concert Band normally per-

forms a diverse repertoire which includes original band compositions and orchestral transcriptions, popular Broadway and show tunes, marches, and patriotic selections. The December 3th show will be an exception as it will be a Christmas Holiday Concert.

This is the second appearance of the Band of Flight Concert Band in Cleveland. Another Air

Force Band, The Band of Flight Jazz Band, performed a concert in February of 2004. Both concerts were sold out.

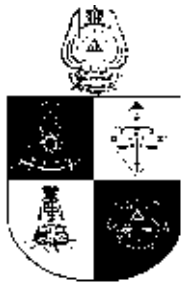

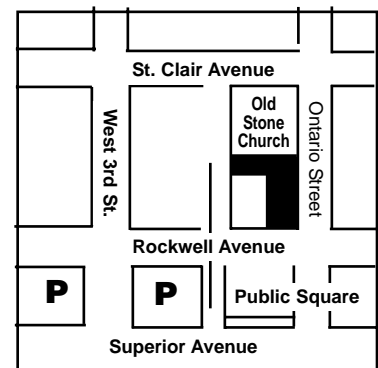
