OFFICER SPOTLIGHT



This month's Officer Spotlight takes us to Bahurim Council Princes of Jerusalem. Sublime Prince Franck Kakou is currently serving as High Priest.

He resides in Moreland Hills, Ohio with his wife Wendy. They have two children, Alexander and Margot. He is a graduate of The Culinary Institutes of Paris, France. After serving three years in the French Military as a paratrooper with three tours in foreign soil, he worked in several countries in Europe. In 1994 he immigrated to the United States and worked in Philadelphia and Minneapolis. They relocated to Cleveland in 1999 and he created two business in the beverage industry.

Sublime Prince Kakou was initiated an Entered Apprentice in "President de Montesqieu

Lodge" in the Province of Paris in 1992 (This Lodge doesn't exist anymore). He was passed to the degree of Fellow Craft in Lyndhurst Lodge in St Paul, Minneapolis. After moving to Cleveland he finally found his real mother lodge, Forest City Lodge #388 in Lyndhurst, Ohio where he served as Worshipful Master 2008. Forest City Lodge won the Mark Twain Masonic Award in 2009 under his leadership. This award was a national competition by the MSA and no lodges in Ohio had ever participated. The award has since been discontinued.

He is a Past High Priest of Heights Chapter #206 (two terms) and is currently the Secretary. He is a member of Woodward Council #118, Recorder of Coeur de Lion Commandery #64, and a member of Al Koran Shriner. Franck was appointed by Most Excellent Companion Robert Dray, 33° as the Grand Representative for the Royal Arch in France in 2014 and appointed by Most Worshipful Brother Steven E. Cokonougher as the Grand representative for the Grand Lodge of Israel in 2015.

Sublime Prince Kakou joined the Valley of Cleveland in 2000 and was appointed to the line of Bahurim Council, Princes of Jerusalem in 2010 by John Sperber, 33°. He is dedicated to his family, enjoys sailing, skiing, and shooting.


