NINE members of our Valley have agreed to join the Builder's Council. We are well on our way to 20 new members.


It is our hope to have the Sovereign Grand Commander, Illustrious Brother David Glattly, 33° to visit our Valley to present all new members with their new tie.

WHAT IS THE HAUTS GRADES ACADEMY?

HGA is a program designed to promote the education, knowledge, and engagement of members in the Scottish Rite, NMJ. The Scottish Rite was known as the *Hauts Grades* in its early beginnings.

The program is made up of three exciting levels:

Level One – The candidate will delve into the ritual of all twenty-nine Scottish Rite, NMJ degrees

Level Two – The essay portion of the curriculum will allow for self-reflection and review of Scottish Rite degrees selected personally by the candidate.

Level Three – A written research paper on a topic of the candidate's choice, which will

be pre-approved and reviewed by the HGA committee. Research topics can vary between history, ritual, and the philosophy of the Scottish Rite.

At full completion, the graduate will earn the honor of becoming a Scottish Rite Hauts Grades Academic and will be entitled to include the letters HGA after his name. A certificate and HGA jewel will also be awarded upon completion, but an enriching educational experience is the overall goal.



The Medina County Scottish Rite Society is happy to announce that our annual Halloween party is on for 2020!


