A KID LIKE ME



The Children's Dyslexia Centers initiated a promotional program in 2020 entitled A Kid Like Me. A Kid Like Me profiles children who benefited from services at the Centers with a photo and short text describing their reading progress resulting from their enrollment.

The Children's Dyslexia Center Cleveland will be featuring two students who just happen to be siblings. Aidan is a graduate of the program and his younger sister Emma is currently enrolled. Both children exhibit the characteristics found with dyslexia that

often result in poor reading skills. Additionally, they are bright, creative, and engaging children with many interests, which include the desire to read and learn to their potential. The fact that Aiden and Emma are siblings demonstrates the fact that dyslexia is genetic.

Emma is in the third grade and is doing very well with the online tutoring provided by the Dyslexia Center. Due to the explicit multisensory instruction provided, Emma now likes to read and is currently reading an American Girl book. Her brother Aidan, upon graduation, was an independent reader and a great role model for his sister. Aidan is now in the fifth grade and his interests include music and math.

At this time, the Cleveland Center has 23 children enrolled and receiving services with online tutoring via Zoom. The Center is now established at its new location (Children's Dyslexia Center Inc. Cleveland, 1150 Linda Street, Rocky River, Ohio 44116) and in-person tutoring will resume in April.

All of the children enrolled at the Center are unique. We are proud to be serving children who represent the diverse population found within the Northeast Ohio region. The students enrolled at the Center reside throughout seven counties, represent sixteen municipalities with thirty percent residing in Cleveland proper, and range in age from eight to fourteen.

In accordance with the Organization's mission, we provide the highest quality, state-of-the-art, multisensory tutorial reading and written language instruction to children with dyslexia.
