Valley Celebrates Faith

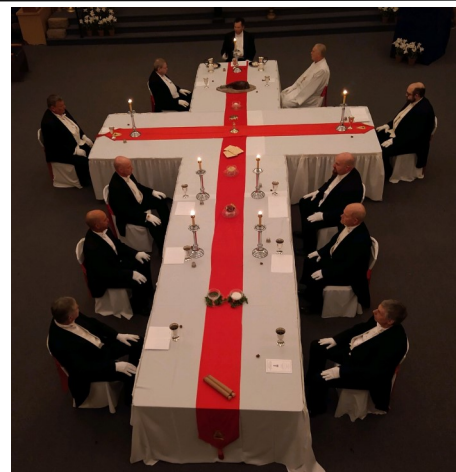

OUTDOOR DEGREE FEATURES CONSISTORY

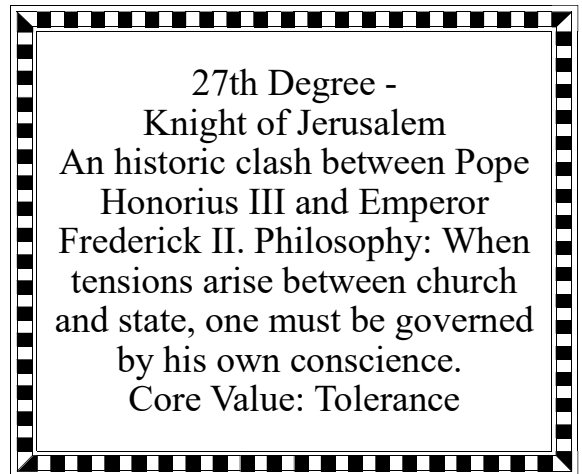
