RETIRING REMARKS FROM OUR SOVERIGN PRINCE

Masonic labor is truly a labor of love, and working alongside valued and trusted Brothers is one of the most fulfilling ways to express our love of our Craft. Yet there are times when we all, as human beings, become fatigued in our efforts. The strong temptation we may face is to become complacent and perhaps even frustrated. Unfortunately many men don't realize that complacency and even frustration is highly contagious and can deeply affect their Brethren.

Nigh on seventeen years ago, this was a situation in which I found myself as a newer Master Mason.

The time had come for Masonic labors to begin. A Brother to whom I looked for leadership had unceremoniously plunked down into his chair, and loudly grumbled that he didn't know why he bothered "doing this" any more. After adjusting to the initial surprise of such an unexpected utterance, I asked myself a horrifying question: "Then why am I doing this?".


